- IBM PC (Pentium 166 Mhz or higher processor) (Intel 266 Mhz recommended)
- 16 MB RAM (32 MB Recommended)
- S-VGA Monitor with (640X480 X 16 Bit colors)
- 8X CD-ROM Drive
- 16 Bit Soundblaster compatible board with Headphones or Speakers

Installing Hinduism from the CD onto your hard drive

If you are familiar with installing PC Software, you may have already run one of the setup programs on this disc. If not, here is how to install the Hinduism software.

For Win 95 or 98 users :

1. Determine which letter designates your CD drive (in this example we'll use d:)
2. From the start button. Choose Run, type d:\setup.exe and press Enter
3. Press Full Install (this will install the necessary runtime files to your harddisk)
4. Setup will attempt to detect whether sound card is present.
5. Setup does not alter your AUTOEXEC.BAT or CONFIG.SYS files
6. Upon completion, Setup creates a \Hinduism directory on your hard disk and places Hinduism runtime files there. On Win 95 and Win 98 systems, it adds icons to your desktop.
